This is an element of propaganda.</p> <p>Banksy is a famous modern street artist who uses stencils. Banksy’s artwork often gives a political or societal message.</p> <p>A stela is a structure used to represent identity from Maya Civilisation.</p> <p>The Great Wave is a famous piece of art by Japanese artist Katsushika Hokusai.</p>
