The Amazon Rainforest and River:

The Amazon River flows through Peru, Bolivia, Ecuador, Brazil, Venezuela, and Colombia. The nine nations that have the Amazon rainforest in their borders are: **Brazil, Peru, Colombia, Venezuela, Ecuador, Bolivia, Guyana, Suriname and French Guiana.** 10% of the world's known species live in the Amazon rainforest. 20% of the world's bird species live in the Amazon rainforest. It is home to around 2 and a half million different insect species as well as over 40000 plant species.

Christopher Columbus 'discovered' the Americas in 1492 when he landed on an island in the Bahamas. He had been attempting to sail to China and East Asia and believed he had made it and had no idea he had discovered a new continent.

Current topical issues:

Deforestation is when the forest is destroyed. Fires are used to clear the forest. Reasons for deforestation include:

- increasing population
- logging
- cattle grazing
- mining
- soya plantations
- hydroelectric dams

Deforestation means fewer trees and this means the Amazon rainforest is now capturing one third less of the carbon in our atmosphere than it did just ten years ago. This increased carbon load on the climate will grow annually, accelerating changes in the climate and weather patterns. Climate change is causing problems all over the world.
