## **English**

We will be looking at the texts 'Katie in London' and 'Katie in Scotland' by James Mayhew and 'The Twits' by Roald Dahl. We will be focusing on:

- Understanding what we have read in a text;
- Using noun phrases;
- Using the past tense;
- Using pronouns for cohesion;

### Maths

The Year 1 and 2 units which will be covered include:

### Year 1

- Counting forwards and backwards;
- Skills for counting;
- Number recognition;
- Writing number and representing numbers;

### Science Materials

Looking at suitability of materials and how shapes can be changed.
Identifying and comparing the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses.

- Forming sentences focusing on capital letters, full stops and finger spaces;
- Using adjectives;
- Using topical vocabulary.

Please record any reading undertaken at home in your child's Home Reading Record Book, by initialling it and writing the date. You may wish to record the page number and a short comment. Please note only reading at home is recorded in this book; we keep our own records for reading in school.

- Number formation;
- Developing awareness of the addition and subtraction and strategies for solving simple problems;
- Sequencing events using chronological language;
- Recognising and naming 2D shapes.

#### Year 2

- Place value of 2-digit numbers, up to 100;
- Comparing and ordering numbers;
- Number bonds within, and to, 20;
- Adding and subtracting 2-digit and 1-digit numbers;
- Adding and subtracting 2-digit numbers and 10s;
- 2D shapes and their properties;
- 3D shapes and their properties;
- Measuring, comparing and ordering mass and capacity (kg/g, I/ml).

## **Theme**

We will learn to:

Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding sea.

Understand seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK.

Use basic geographical vocabulary to refer to key physical features.
