HISTORY

- Use appropriate vocabulary and presentation methods when communicating ideas about history.
- **Describe changes** that have happened over time, understanding why these have happened.
- **Make connections** between events that occurred in the same time period and across different time periods understanding chronology.
- Use their knowledge to **discuss and evaluate the past**, formulating and refining questions and lines of enquiry.
- Think critically about historical evidence and sources, understanding how and why people interpret the past in different ways.

GEOGRAPHY

- Use appropriate geographical vocabulary when describing the location and characteristics of different places.
- Make connections between human and physical environments.
- **Make connections** between places, knowing how they are interdependent and interconnected.
- Accurately use and interpret sources that provide information about places, e.g. maps, globes, aerial photographs, GIS, data collected through fieldwork.
- **Discuss and evaluate sources** to develop an understanding of how the geographical characteristics of a location have changed over time.
- **Think critically**, applying their knowledge, about current and contemporary issues in society and the environment.

RE

- **Use appropriate vocabulary** when describing and discussing beliefs, values, practices and ways of life within any religion.
- Make connections between the study of religion and belief and personal reflections on meaning and purpose.
- **Think critically**, being able to ask significant and highly reflective questions about religion and participate in discussions about these.

MUSIC

- Use rhythm and pattern to perform vocally and instrumentally.
- **Use appropriate musical vocabulary** to discuss and explain compositions, both live and recorded, from a range of styles, genres and time periods.
- **Make connections** between how music is created, produced and communicated (including how musical dimensions can be varied).
- **Explain reasoning** when improvising and composing own pieces, with reference to knowledge learnt.

ART AND DESIGN

- **Be proficient** in drawing, painting, sculpting and other art and design techniques.
- Use appropriate vocabulary when analysing and evaluating own creative work and that of others, including famous artists and designers.
- **Think critically** about how art and design reflect and shape history and the events of society.

DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

- **Be proficient** in technical and practical skills needed to design and make a product.
- Use appropriate vocabulary when testing, analysing and evaluating own work and that of others.
- Make connections to knowledge and skills drawn from other disciplines, solving real and relevant problems and drawing on work of key events and individuals.
- **Think critically** when making choices during the design process, referring to purpose and suitability of materials and methods.
