Published: 8 December 2023 Effective: 4 January 2024



- The Early Years Foundation Stage are the stages of education for children from birth to the end of the reception year.
- It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Being confident to speak to others about own needs, opinions and interests.

Initiating conversations.

Playing in a group and elaborating on ideas.



Being aware of boundaries and behavioural expectations within the setting.



Being confident to try new activities and show independence, resilience and perseverance in the face of a challenge.

Managing their own basic hygiene and personal needs, including dressing, going to the toilet and understanding the importance of healthy food choices.

Communication and Language

Listening and responding to others.

Talking about why things may happen.

Asking questions to deepen their own knowledge.



Responding to instructions

Expressing their own ideas and feelings about their experiences.

Experimenting different ways of moving.

Holding a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing.

Using a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes and cutlery.

Writing recognisable letters.

Writing meaningful sentences

Spelling words by identifying sounds in them and representing the sounds with a letter or letters.

Mathematics

Having a deep understanding of number to 10, including the composition of each number.



Exploring and representing patterns within numbers up to 10, including evens and odds, double facts and how quantities can be distributed equally.

Verbally counting beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting system.

Understanding of the World

Talking about special events for family and friends

> Enjoying joining in with family customs and routines



Showing care and concern about the environment.

Understanding the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling. Exploring the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants.

Expressive Arts and Design



Safely using and exploring a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.

Sharing their creations, explaining the process they have used.

Singing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs.

Performing songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others.
