Introduction:

The Sport Industry Research Centre at Sheffield Hallam University has been contracted by Sport England to conduct an independent validation on 325 schools covering 225 SGO areas for the 2018/19 period. As part of our validation visits we have been asked to make recommendations regarding improving the Mark criteria for future years and therefore the criteria for this year is again subject to changes based on the feedback we receive and the validations completed. Hamble Primary School provided evidence of meeting or exceeding the required criteria in order to achieve the Gold School Games Mark. The key School Games Mark criteria relating to the Gold award are highlighted below and a green /red score has been made in relation to the evidence seen or discussed with the validation team.

Comments

Hamble Primary School was awarded the Gold Mark award following the validation visit with a portfolio of evidence in place to support all areas of the Mark award. The validation highlighted that the school was offering a very strong sports programme across all areas of the award, including:

- The school offers a range of sports at intra and inter level, with 10 sports at intra and 6 at inter level. In addition, the school has organised fixtures for 3 B and 2 C teams.
- The school has an excellent strategy to engage the least active pupils. Pupils that don't engage in any sporting activities are released from an assembly to take part in an activity of their choice, which is delivered by external specialist coaches.
- Hamble has a good extra-curricular offer, with various clubs taking place after-school and these clubs change on a ½ termly rota. Overall 54% of students are engaged in extra-curricular clubs.
- The school has a good leadership programme for years 5 and 6, engaging 20% of pupils in sporting leadership activities. Young leaders support the school's sports day and the various inter-house competitions.
- The school engages various external coaches to support its extra-curricular offer and has forged links with 9 local sports clubs.

The school should be proud of this application and the evidence collated as part of the process.
