

Sports Premium Grant 2016-17

During this year the money we received through the Sports Premium Grant was spent on:

- Kris Richards to support in raising the profile of sport through the use of Sports Leaders to help set up and run intra-house competitions and clubs. Staff undertook CPD on OAA activities (£1700). This has resulted in increased staff confidence and more outdoor activities being planned in as part of the general curriculum for the children.
- Health and Safety inspection undertaken and new resources provided depending on the outcome of this (approx. £1000)
- Entry costs for Hampshire Games based competitions and related supply costs / coaches cost approx. £1000. As a school we participated in more events than last year and achieved the School Games Silver Mark.
- Funded provision of after school football club for Year 5/6 (£1000). The children enjoyed these sessions and participated in matched that contributed to the School Games Mark.
- Cost of lifeguard training for staff to enable us to teach swimming. (£100 per person)
- Y 5/6 children using HCSC for their swimming lessons (cost of swimming teachers and hire is approx. £800)
- The small outdoor play equipment was replenished and this has encouraged more active play during break times. (£300)
- There was still a significant cost for the general maintenance of our on-site swimming pool this year. It was decommissioned over the summer as it was not a cost effective way to use the sports premium money or school budget. There is a plan over the coming years to move swimming down to Year 4 rather than Year 5/6 as we feel that it is better to have the children swimming younger.

Key Outcomes for 2016/17 evidenced through the achievement of the School Games Silver Mark

Action Plan for Spending the Sports Premium Grant for Academic Year 2017-18

Total Grant: £15,243

- Anomaly Screens to be purchased to support with Healthy Eating and increasing activity messages. Cost: £1,200 (in total £3,520 over 3 years)
- Buy in to the cluster schools Core Offer (Kris Richards) This will include OAA activities for the children from a specialist teacher and also CPD for our Forest Schools / OEd teacher on how the our OEd curriculum can be expanded to include aspects of the National Curriculum for PE. Cost: £1,600.
- CPD for staff to ensure all teaching staff are qualified to teach gymnastics (as per the national requirements). Cost: Approx. £1000
- Purchasing of outdoor play equipment to encourage more activity during break times. Cost £500

Due to the increased amount of the grant, we will now be considering the use of the additional money to put towards a MUGA to provide opportunities for active play through the winter months when we are unable to make use of our school field for larger scale games, such as football.
