## Sports Premium Report Review of 2019-20 / Plan for 2020 – 21

## Sustainable choices for our school – continuing to leave positive and engaging resources for all from our Sports Premium.

This year we have made a very similar addition to the previous – continuing to make choices that will sustain the high profile of Physical Education, Physical Activity and School Sport (PESSPA)at Hamble Primary School and supporting the 30:30 government initiatives at even more unstructured times, such as break-time and lunch-time.

We were fortunate to have received £18,760 and chose to further invest the large majority of this (£16,533) into our 'Healthy Choices' track. We did this by adding a selection of 'outdoor gym' style equipment at regular intervals around our track. These pieces of equipment were chosen by our School Council and taken by them to the rest of their classes to decide which ones would go where and why.

These pieces of equipment are open to the children at break-time and lunch-time and have encouraged even the least active of children to walk around our track to get to the inviting equipment. These pieces of equipment are all designed to support the children's Fundamental Movement Skills (FMS), such as balance, climbing, jumping and of course running. This has further supported our work as a school to improve these and therefore the children's learning and achievement in Physical Education and Development, from as early as EYFS. They have added an even more noticeable commitment to promoting PESSPA in our school environment and are something that we hope the children can continue to use for many years to come.

The remainder of the money (£2,227) has been spent on equipment for the school for both lessons and break and lunch times. These pieces of equipment are vital to providing the children with high- quality lessons, availability of sport specific resources and also encouraging them to play and experiment with these pieces of equipment in their own time. These also included items that will sustain this equipment such as storage and pumps. This amount also paid for the PESSPA leader within the school to have some targeted subject leader time to further consider our curriculum and assessment in Physical Education. This included undertaking a staff meeting for all teaching staff. The subject leader also spent some time with the Hampshire PE development manager to support this, however the cost of this did not come from the Sports Premium funding.

We strongly believe that all of the above uses of our generous Sports Premium funding continue to be measurable by the 5 key indicators.

• The first of these key indicators is to continue to engage all pupils in regular physical activity. As this is available to the children during their break and lunch times it has definitely continued to encourage higher levels of physical activity. It has also provided staff with a more easily accessible way to promote this and staff can be seen encouraging and accompanying the children in this area, even in their own time.

- The second, raise the profile of PE and School Sport for whole school improvement, has been easily achieved by this addition to our school grounds. It has shown a commitment by us to continue this work and again staff are more easily able to contribute in this way as well as many others.
- Thirdly, some of the money was used to support increasing confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE. By giving the subject leader some focussed time on Physical Education, alongside the Hampshire PE development manager, the curriculum could continue to be carefully considered. This also meant that resources to support teachers with planning were made and all of these messages conveyed and explained to teaching staff within staff meetings. A survey of teaching staff has taken place since which had shown a good reception of this and has provided clear next steps to continue working towards.
- In terms of broadening the children's experience of sports and activities, this has taken place throughout our Physical Education and extra-curricular clubs have continue to run. Sadly, this was planned to be based around the 2020 Olympics in the latter part of this year which was of course cancelled due to COVID 19.
- Finally, increasing participation in competitive sport faced a similar predicament due to COVID 19. Although we did continue to attend as many competitive events in the Autumn and Spring terms, the majority of these are timed in the Summer term. We did however when we had the opportunities, continue to monitor the rates of participation and focussed on our Children with Special Educational Needs, and will continue to do so next year.

## Looking forward to next year:

We are incredibly pleased that the Sports Premium funding has again been confirmed for the academic year 20-21. We will be spending this money on continuing to add to our resources both equipment for lessons and those more prominent resources in our school grounds. We hope to continue to carefully chose those that will engage and motivate all of the children, at all ages and support both fundamental movement skills and more advanced skills and exploration in the older children.

We are also aware that there may need to be some extra support provided for our upper Key Stage 2 children with regards to swimming and the impact of COVID-19. This is something we will consider and may use Sports Premium to support us with if necessary.

We will also be investing some of this money in CPD for staff, particularly new staff, to ensure that they feel confident when teaching Physical Education and promoting Physical Activity and School Sport. This will continue to support the PESSPA leader and SLT in monitoring the teaching of Physical Education and awareness of all staff's strengths and developments.

We look forward to another exciting year for PESSPA at Hamble Primary School.
